WHEREAS, every person is endowed with human dignity and value; and

WHEREAS, redemption and second chances are true American values; and

WHEREAS, approximately 65 million Americans have a criminal record,

including 2,231,100 Louisianans; and

WHEREAS, the Council of State Governments reports that the number of

legal collateral consequences of a criminal conviction exceeds

48,000, including 1,494 specific to Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, these barriers can contribute to recidivism, which increases

victimization and decreases public safety; and

WHEREAS, the designation of April as Second Chance Month would

contribute to increased public awareness about the need for closure for those who have paid their debt, and opportunities for individuals, employers, congregations and communities to

avtand second changes

extend second chances.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, John Bel Edwards, Governor of the State of Louisiana, do

hereby proclaim April 2018 as

SECOND CHANCE MONTH

in the State of Louisiana.
