Volunteers from your church or organization will purchase and deliver gifts to prisoners' children on behalf of their incarcerated parents and share with them the hope of the Gospel. Some churches and organizations also decide to take the next step and envelop these children and their families into the life of the church through a year-round relationship and other ministry opportunities.

Prison Fellowship's Statement of Faith

The Foundation of What We Believe

As a Christian organization, Prison Fellowship believes in the full authority of the Bible as God's inspired word and the complete tenets of the Apostle's and Nicene Creeds.
