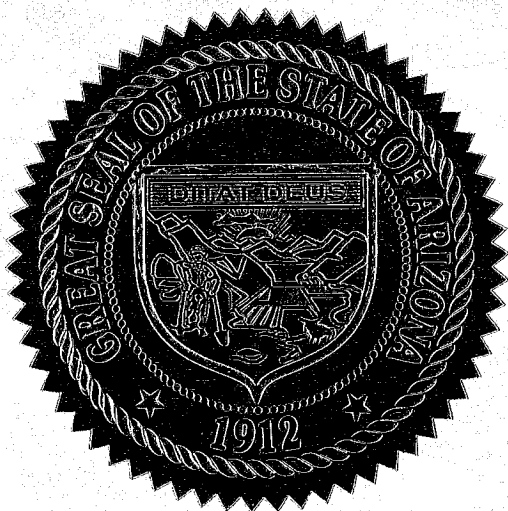

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, an estimated 70 million Americans have a criminal record, with 42,441 individuals incarcerated and 85,000 individuals under supervision by community corrections in Arizona; and
WHEREAS, approximately 95 percent of individuals held in state prisons will eventually be released back into the community after having completed their sentence; and
WHEREAS, individuals who have served their time and paid their debt to society deserve a real second chance to turn their lives around; and
WHEREAS, many individuals who are released from custody face significant barriers to obtaining employment and housing, including lack of in-demand job skills, lack of high school degree, substance abuse disorder, and mental illness; and
WHEREAS, studies have shown that education programs, job training programs, and substance abuse treatment provided in correctional settings reduce recidivism rates; and
WHEREAS, in March 2017, the Department of Economic Security (DES) and the Department of Corrections, Rehabilitation, and Reentry opened the first Second Chance Center bringing comprehensive workforce readiness services to inmates nearing release, which includes participation in on-site job fairs, enrollment in healthcare and nutrition assistance, as well as connections to housing, clothing, and transportation; and
WHEREAS, Second Chance Centers have expanded to three prisons and a total of 4,127 inmates have completed the program with 2,534 individuals obtaining gainful employment upon release, as of January 30, 2020.
NOW, THEREFORE, I, Douglas A. Ducey, Governor of the State of Arizona, do hereby proclaim April 2020 as

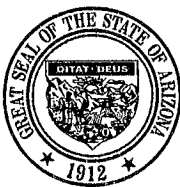

Terms and Conditions

Enclosed is a proclamation signed by the Governor of the State of Arizona. This proclamation is a formal recognition made by the Governor and is provided pursuant to a request from an Arizona resident or approved non-profit organization. It is strictly honorary and designed to recognize notable state and local events.

Because this proclamation, as with all others, is given on a case-by-case basis, and is usually used to recognize a special event, non-profit organization, and/or regional or national meetings held in Arizona, its only authorized use is in conjunction with the event for which it was given. This authorization extends to your right to read the proclamation aloud at the event, display the proclamation at the event and print it in materials associated with the event (i.e. event programs). ***You may not otherwise republish the proclamation unless explicit written consent is granted from the Governor's Office.***

Because the Governor's Office receives many requests for proclamations and relies, in large part, on information submitted along with the request to complete the proclamation, you should not interpret the issuance of the proclamation as a sponsorship or endorsement of your organization, its activities or its membership, and you are prohibited from representing otherwise.
