WHEREAS, Redemption and second chances are American values; and

WHEREAS, An estimated 70 million Americans have a criminal record, with over

5,000 individuals incarcerated and 14,000 individuals on probation

and parole in Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, The Council of State Governments reports that the number of legal

collateral consequences of a criminal conviction exceeds 44,000,

including 730 consequences specific to Nebraska; and

WHEREAS, Youth in America face more than 1,000 collateral consequences

affecting their high school and higher education; and

WHEREAS, Helping people successfully return to the community reduces

recidivism, which in turn reduces victimization and increases public

safety; and

WHEREAS,

The designation of April as Second Chance Month contributes to increased public awareness about the need for closure for those who

have paid their debt, and opportunities for individuals, employers,

congregations, and communities to extend second chances.

NOW, THEREFORE,

I, Pete Ricketts, Governor of the State of Nebraska, DO HEREBY

PROCLAIM the month of April 2022 as

SECOND CHANCE MONTH

in Nebraska, and I do hereby urge all citizens to take due note of the observance.
